




The CND OHT is pleased to welcome Dr. Kunuk Rhee to the staff support team as the Lead, Population Health and Special Projects

9-8-8 Suicide Helpline Available Canada-Wide

The launch of 9-8-8 suicide crisis helpline, a new Canada-wide three-digit helpline, will provide urgent, mental health support in real-time.

Accessible by text and phone, 9-8-8 will provide quick access to bilingual support from trained responders who can properly assess individuals in need of crisis support and direct them to resources and services across the community.

Congratulations Two Rivers Family Health Team and Grandview **Medical Centre Family Health Team**





At this year's Association of Family Health Teams of Ontario (AFHTO) conference, Two Rivers Family Health Team and Grandview Medical Centre Family Health Team received the 2023 Bright Lights Award for their contribution to organizing primary care to advance Ontario Health Teams.

The award was presented to the two organizations for their leadership and contribution to the planning and implementation of the CND OHT Community Mental Health and Addictions Clinic (C-MAC) Pilot Project.

"The financial contribution by Two Rivers and Grandview to the CND OHT Mental Health and Addictions Co-Design Group was just the spark that was needed to bring this locally developed solution from change idea to pilot implementation," said Kristina Eliashevsky, Director for the CND OHT.

As a result of the 8-week pilot project, 123 clients were able to access quick access mental health and addictions support. A comprehensive evaluation plan was put in place to understand the impact of the clinic and the data is now being used to advocate for permanent funding for the model.

Local Ontario Health teams want to divert mental health crisis

calls away from hospitals

This week, the CND OHT presented to Region of Waterloo Council on the Community Mental Health and Addictions Clinic (C-MAC) impact.

The presentation was part of a report on progress developing a coordinated Region of Waterloo Alternate Destination of Care to Emergency Department transfers by paramedics, for those experiencing mental health and addictions concerns.
